Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of
God.

Because of the difficult times in which we now live, it is imperative that
we who know Jesus as Lord and Savior allow Him to use us to pray for and
encourage our brothers and sisters. Their/our lives depend on our
functioning in unity as His Body.

Let me share with you a lesson I learned personally in what it means to
pray when the Holy Spirit directs, to take seriously the need to be obedient in
prayer. A friend of mine, E.F. was a Bible translator with Wycliffe Bible
Translators. I was sharing some of my thoughts on a tape to send to E.F.
when suddenly there came a strong burden to pray for her. I stopped the
recording and began praying – feeling fear and even panic. I prayed
earnestly for E.F.'s protection until the fear and panic left and the burden
lifted. Then I resumed the recording, telling E.F. what had just happened –
how I felt the need to pray for her.

E.F., who was also a nurse, was moved several times to help with
translators who were ill. Three months passed. One day while E.F. walked
alone on a dirt road to practice her language skills, a vehicle slowed beside
her, and several young men tried to get her into the car with them. She began
praying; they left but turned around and came back. They did this again,
then suddenly left without harming her.

When E.F. returned to her room and checked her mail, there was the tape
just delivered that morning that had been sent three months earlier. E.F.'s
response was, "Do you believe God had you praying three months ago for
my protection this morning?"

Ask E.F. how important it is that we be faithful to pray.

Psa 119:11 Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin
against thee.
