Amo 7:7 Thus he shewed me: and, behold, the Lord stood upon a wall [made] by a plumbline, with a plumbline in his hand.

How is it with your soul?

We looked at each other, and, without words, each of us went to the vehicle to see if it would now start. Yes, it did. Our lives were spared because the vehicle did not start the moment we wanted it to.

When has the Lord intervened for you? Worship the Lord and give Him glory due His Holy Name.
