[made] by a plumbline, with a plumbline in his hand.

## How is it with your soul?

Some say, "I can do as I please because the Lord is forgiving." No, to the first part. Yes! to the second part. We cannot walk as we please. We cannot walk with the world; the Bible teaches that we are to separate ourselves from the world: "Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean [thing]; and I will receive you..." (II Cor 6.17). We are to walk in the righteousness and holiness of the Lord God in Christ Jesus.

The Lord does forgive, but when we repent of our sins, we will not continue in sin. I John 1.5-10 makes this clear.

This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.

If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth:

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.

If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us [our] sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

### Plumbline: Isaiah 30.21

"... This is the way, walk ye in it ..."

Perhaps there needs to be some soul searching as King David prayed:

Psa 139:23 Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts:

Psa 139:24 And see if [there be any] wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

# Walking in the Light

Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Father, thank You for sending Your only Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the Cross of Calvary for my sins. Jesus, I ask You to forgive me of my sins, and come into my heart and life to be my Lord and Savior.

Thank You, Jesus, for loving me and for coming into my heart and life to be my Lord and Savior. Guide me day to day to live for You, to trust You with my life as I desire to walk in obedience to Your will.

Amen.

When the enemy comes in to tell you that was just a "high" moment, that nothing happened, you, in the Name of Jesus Christ, begin praising the Lord Jesus for what He did in your life when you prayed this prayer.

Walk on in Jesus, read His Word daily. If you do not know where to begin, read a verse or so in Psalms, but read that verse or two several times, asking the Lord what He wants of you today. Praise Him, thank Him for what He has done for you.

Psa 119:11 Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee.
