Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of
God.

Does it seem that such experiences as are shared in this *Message* always
happen to someone else – never to you? Are you thinking, “My life is just
ordinary; nothing fantastic happens to me?”

God works in the ordinariness of life just as powerfully as in the desperate
situations.

Perhaps you have travelled alone without incident, or just missed being in an
accident of which you were never aware. A thief has never broken into your
home – though this has happened to others. Or, maybe you have enjoyed good
health and have been able to work or manage a business successfully.

How many of us go through life not realizing how many times the Lord
Jesus Christ has gone before us and covered us and prevented our hurt, our being
injured or worse? How many times have any of us been traveling and were
slowed down because of some “slow-poke” in front of us when we were wanting
to pass the person and get on with our trip – only to find farther up the road there
was an accident in which we might have been involved had it not been for that –
