## The Lord Jesus Is Faithful

**V**erses that have been with us for months, that the Lord Jesus has shown us over and over as we have read throughout His Holy Word – if we are walking in obedience to the Lord Jesus faithfully, are listed below that you might with more ease read with your heart, opening your heart to hear from the Lord Jesus Christ what it is He has for you

Oh, the Lord loves you and is calling you to experience His faithfulness – in the midst of the trials and temptations that come your way. He is revealing to you His love, and that you have no need of fear as He directs your path. No, that does not mean the enemy will not come against you and endeavor to distract you - that you might take your eyes off of the Lord Jesus Christ and the calling that He has upon your life in Him.

I will send my fear before thee, and will destroy all the people to whom thou shalt come, and I will make all thine enemies turn their backs unto thee (Ex 23.27).

**Be strong and of a good courage, fear not, nor be afraid of them: for the LORD thy God, he [it is] that doth go with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee.**

And Moses called unto Joshua, and said unto him in the sight of all Israel, **Be strong and of a good courage:** for thou must go with this people unto the land which the LORD hath sworn unto their fathers to give them; and thou shalt cause them to inherit it (Dt 31.6-7).

And **the LORD, he [it is] that doth go before thee; he will be with thee, he will not fail thee, neither forsake thee: fear not, neither be dismayed** (Dt 31.8).

There shall not any man be able to stand before thee all the days of thy life: as I was with Moses, **[so] I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee.**

**Be strong and of a good courage:** for unto this people shalt thou divide for an inheritance the land, which I swear unto their fathers to give them.

**Only be thou strong and very courageous,** that thou mayest observe to do according to all the law, which Moses my servant commanded thee: turn

not from it *[to]* the right hand or *[to]* the left, that thou mayest prosper whithersoever thou goest.

This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.

Have not I commanded thee? **Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the LORD thy God *[is]* with thee whithersoever thou goest** (Jos 1.5-9).

And when the servant of the man of God was risen early, and gone forth, behold, an host compassed the city both with horses and chariots. And his servant said unto him, Alas, my master! how shall we do?

And he answered, **Fear not: for they that *[be]* with us *[are]* more than they that *[be]* with them.**

And Elisha prayed, and said, LORD, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see. And the LORD opened the eyes of the young man; and he saw: and, behold, the mountain *[was]* full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha (II K 6.15-17).

O our God, wilt thou not judge them? for we have no might against this great company that cometh against us; neither know we what to do: but our eyes *[are]* upon thee.

And all Judah stood before the LORD, with their little ones, their wives, and their children.

Then upon Jahaziel the son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite of the sons of Asaph, came the Spirit of the LORD in the midst of the congregation;

And he said, Hearken ye, all Judah, and ye inhabitants of Jerusalem, and thou king Jehoshaphat, Thus saith the LORD unto you, **Be not afraid nor dismayed** by reason of this great multitude; for the battle *[is]* not yours, but God's.

morrow go ye down against them: behold, they come up by the cliff of Ziz; and ye shall find them at the end of the brook, before the wilderness of Jeruel.

**Ye shall not *[need]* to fight in this *[battle]*: set yourselves, stand ye *[still]*, and see the salvation of the LORD with you**, O Judah and Jerusalem: fear not, nor be dismayed; to morrow go out against them: **for the LORD *[will be]* with you.**

And Jehoshaphat bowed his head with *[his]* face to the ground: and all Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem fell before the LORD, worshipping the LORD.

And the Levites, of the children of the Kohathites, and of the children of the Korhites, stood up to praise the LORD God of Israel with a loud voice on high.

And they rose early in the morning, and went forth into the wilderness of Tekoa: and as they went forth, Jehoshaphat stood and said, Hear me, O Judah, and ye inhabitants of Jerusalem; **Believe in the LORD your God, so shall ye be established; believe his prophets, so shall ye prosper.**

And when he had consulted with the people, he appointed singers unto the LORD, and that should praise the beauty of holiness, as they went out before the army, and to say, Praise the LORD; for his mercy *[endureth]* for ever.

And when they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah; and they were smitten (II Ch 20.12-22).

**Be strong and courageous, be not afraid nor dismayed** for the king of Assyria, nor for all the multitude that *[is]* with him: **for *[there be]* more with us than with him:**

With him *[is]* an arm of flesh; but with us *[is]* the LORD our God to help us, and to fight our battles. And the **people rested themselves upon the words** of Hezekiah king of Judah (II Ch 32.7, 8).

And thou, son of man, **be not afraid of them, neither be afraid of their words**, though briars and thorns *[be]* with thee, and thou dost dwell among scorpions: **be not afraid of their words, nor be dismayed at their looks**, though they *[be]* a rebellious house.

And thou shalt speak my words unto them, whether they will hear, or whether they will forbear: for they *[are]* most rebellious (Eze 2.6, 7).

Take notice that the Lord God calls Ezekiel to speak forth the truth of God in Christ Jesus to a people who are impudent and stiffhearted, a rebellious nation. Though the Lord knows this, He still sends Ezekiel to them to speak the truth; they cannot say they were not warned of what is to come in their disobedience to the Lord. So, you may be sent to speak the truth to someone whom you know will not listen, but you can at least give forth the truth knowing the decision is upon them to hear, to obey the Word of the Lord.

Carefully re-read the scriptures above, seeking the Lord's strength and courage and confidence in Him that you shall go forth doing the bidding of the Lord and for His glory, come what may. It is easy to be discouraged, to take our eyes off of the Lord Who calls us by name. The world calls and pulls at the followers of the Lord Jesus Christ and even mocks them as they endeavor to stand fast with the Lord. The enemy uses whom he will to taunt you, to cause you to feel unacceptable when you choose not to walk with the world. The enemy is ever present to pull you down, feeling you are walking alone, causing you to wonder if you are doing the Lord's bidding - when so many are walking the broad way.

It is at this time that we must seek the Lord on our knees. We must bend the knee and cry out to the Lord to strengthen us in our walk with Him that we might not falter and turn away.
