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Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

And, there is one ready made for you to give forth as the truth of a god as though they had studied many hours on the sermon. The sad part is that those listening do not read the Bible nor do they care to understand it. So, therefore, just say anything that makes people feel good – and you have a following.

My point is: How long since you asked the Lord what He wanted preached or taught? How long since you were in love with the Lord and loved His Word, eager to open the Word and see what the Lord has for you? Oh, seek the Lord in your personal life and grow in the Lord – then ask the Lord what HE wants of you.

Then my question is, Why are you standing on the pulpitum instead of behind the pulpit to give forth the Truth of the Lord? Do you love Jesus? Do you know Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior? Have you been called to preach or to teach?

I ask you, Do you love my Lord? the Lord Jesus Christ?
