Amo 7:7 Thus he shewed me: and, behold, the Lord stood upon a wall [made] by a plumbline, with a plumbline in his hand.

How is it with your soul?

We, as the body of Christ, need to lay our lives before the Lord, seeking that we may walk together in Him. We need to submit ourselves unto the Lord Jesus Christ, and respond to Him in obedience, that the Lord will use us in His vineyard, in service to Him.

We are called to be servants. Luke wrote well explaining the role of a servant as he wrote concerning an officer in the Roman army.

Then Jesus went with them. And when he was now not far from the house, the **centurion** sent friends to him, saying unto him, Lord, trouble not thyself: for I am not worthy that thou shouldest enter under my roof:

Wherefore neither thought I myself worthy to come unto thee: but say in a word, and my servant shall be healed.

For I also am a man set under authority, having under me soldiers, and I say unto one, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth [it] (Luke 7.6-8).

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

We are commanded to seek first the Kingdom of God **and** His righteousness. People of God in Christ Jesus, we need to fall in love with the Lord Jesus Christ all over again. Let us take heed lest we begin walking in our own willful way, walking against the will of the Lord, walking as though life is about us personally. We are in a time in which much goes forth as though it were from the Bible - that which is leading people to the broad way. (Heb 10.26, 27)

Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide [is] the gate, and broad [is] the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat:

Because strait [is] the gate, and narrow [is] the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.

Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves (Mt 7.13-15)..

How often is it now said, " Just keep on doing what you are doing because God understands and is forgiving." Be aware of the Word of the Lord (Heb 10.26,27).
