Dual Citizenship brings us to some thoughts concerning the teachings in the Bible. Look more closely to the following scripture and think about it in light of your citizenship.

No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon (Lk 16.13).

Who is your master?

Where is your master?

Who are you now serving?

Where is your home?

Are you preparing for your homegoing?

These are days that we need to ask ourselves some very serious questions and seek the Lord Jesus Christ as we search ourselves in answering the above questions. Perhaps Hebrews 11.9-16 will be helpful.

By faith [Abraham] sojourned in the land of promise, as [in] a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise:

For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker [is] God. Through faith also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, because she judged him faithful who had promised.

Therefore sprang there even of one, and him as good as dead, [so many] as the stars of the sky in multitude, and as the sand which is by the sea shore innumerable. These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of [them], and embraced [them], and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth.

For they that say such things declare plainly that they seek a country. And truly, if they had been mindful of that [country] from whence they came out, they might have had opportunity to have returned.

But now they desire a better [country], that is, an heavenly: wherefore God is not ashamed to be called their God: for he hath prepared for them a city.

For here have we no continuing city, but we seek one to come (Heb 13:14).
