When God speaks, we must respond immediately as we wait upon the Lord.

And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us (Acts 16.9).

People are hungry for the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and, yet, we too often hear of those ready to send help, social and physical help – but, where oh where is the Gospel of Jesus Christ in what is done to help people today. It *seems* we are more concerned about issues in the world and willing to send those who worship multiple gods than to seek those who are called of the Living God, Jesus Christ to tell the world about Jesus Christ. Charles Haddon Spurgeon once preached regarding a need for the Word to be preached in a specific location. He implored the one that was called of God to "Go and Tell" to come forward. But he also made it clear that if a person wanting to go but was not called of the Lord Jesus Christ, they were not to go.

The call Paul received to "come over into Macedonia, and help us" was a call to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ in a pagan country and in the midst of trials and dangers.

I believe there is still a call to "come over and help us," but it is not being heard; it is not being heeded. The sad part is this nation is now in need of someone(s) coming over to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ – here in this nation, to lay before this nation that time is of the essence when time shall be no more and people are going out into eternity without Jesus Christ.

Oh, the time when people wept for the souls of those who knew not Jesus Christ, seeking the Lord in this ministry. There were those who heard to cry for help and went to other countries, and – now? Oh, Again, this nation stands in need of the Gospel being preached on this soil without reservation, without hesitation, without fear – and with great power from the Holy Spirit.
