Behold, bless ye the Lord, all ye servants of the Lord, which by night stand in the house of the Lord.

The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have *[it]* more abundantly (Jn 10:10).

The Word of the Lord teaches us that "...the joy of the LORD is your strength" (Neh 8.10). Jesus goes on in John Ten, verse 11, "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep."

The Psalmist (Chapter 29) makes it clear that we are to worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness, that the Lord God in Christ Jesus is holy, and we are to lift our praises unto the Lord.

Walking in Him, endeavoring to live a life of holiness unto the Lord, blessing His Holy Name, bowing before Him, lifting up holy hands is to "Rejoice in the Lord."

I am reminded of Psalm 37 that is powerful in restoring to us the joy of our salvation.

- Psa 37:1 <[A Psalm] of David.> Fret not thyself because of evildoers, neither be thou envious against the workers of iniquity.
- Psa 37:2 For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, and wither as the green herb.
- Psa 37:3 Trust in the LORD, and do good; *[so]* shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed.
- Psa 37:4 Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.
- Psa 37:5 Commit thy way unto the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring *[it]* to pass.
- Psa 37:6 And he shall bring forth thy righteousness as the light, and thy judgment as the noonday.
- Psa 37:7 Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him: fret not thyself because of him who prospereth in his way, because of the man who bringeth wicked devices to pass.
- Psa 37:8 Cease from anger, and forsake wrath: fret not thyself in any wise to do evil.
- Psa 37:9 For evildoers shall be cut off: but those that wait upon the LORD, they shall inherit the earth.

Let the joy of the Lord arise in you, remembering your salvation in the Lord, forgiveness of sins, and the call of the Lord to a life of holiness in Him. Romans 14.17 reveals to us that Kingdom of God is "peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost." Romans 12.12 reveals that we are to be "rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer."

The life in Christ Jesus is to be as is given to us in Acts 5.41: "And they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for his name."

My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; Knowing *[this]*, that the trying of your faith worked patience (Ja 1.1, 2).

The joy of the Lord causes us to rejoice in Him, what He has done for us, what He is doing for us, and that He causes us to be a servant unto Him, to live a life of holiness. The Lord is our source of joy, which gives to us a peace that passes all understanding. When we have the joy of the Lord and His peace, we will walk in harmony with Him and His calling upon our lives – and, the enemy will not destroy our joy though Satan will continue coming against us if we are serving the Lord God Almighty.

If we are to rejoice for evermore, our prayer life must be constant. We must seek the Lord that we might be strengthened in Him,

The following are some passages of scripture that may help us to more fully understand the command to rejoice in the Lord at all times. Rejoicing is a heart that is gladdened, that is full of the love of the Lord that exudes forth in our countenance, our lives endeavoring to live the life of holiness to which we are called.

Rejoice in the LORD, O ye righteous: *[for]* praise is comely for the upright. (Psa 33:1)
Rejoice in the LORD, ye righteous; and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness. (Psa 97:12)

Thou shalt fan them, and the wind shall carry them away, and the whirlwind shall scatter them: and thou shalt rejoice in the LORD, *[and]* shalt glory in the Holy One of Israel. (Isa 41:16)

I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, my soul shall be joyful in my God; for he hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, he hath covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decketh *[himself]* with ornaments, and as a bride adorneth *[herself]* with her jewels. (Isa 61:10)

Be glad then, ye children of Zion, and rejoice in the LORD your God: for he hath given you the former rain moderately, and he will cause to come down for you the rain, the former rain, and the latter rain in the first *[month]*. (Joe 2:23)

Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation. (Hab 3:18)

And *[they of]* Ephraim shall be like a mighty *[man]*, and their heart shall rejoice as through wine: yea, their children shall see *[it]*, and be glad; their heart shall rejoice in the LORD. (Zec 10:7)

Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you, to me indeed *[is]* not grievous, but for you *[it is]* safe. (Phi 3:1)

Rejoice in the Lord alway: *[and]* again I say, Rejoice. (Phi 4:4)

Very little needs to be written on the joy of the Lord – and, yet, sadly – perhaps it does as so many are not rejoicing in the Lord, are not able to see anything for which they can and should be thankful, especially our salvation in Christ Jesus through His shed blood on the Cross of Calvary..

Have we walked in our own willful ways so long; have we walked with the world and the worldly churches so long; have we taken our eyes off the Lord Jesus Christ; and have we walked that broad way that leads to destruction so long that has caused us to forget the the Lord Jesus Christ dying on the Cross of Calvary, His shedding His blood for our sins – that we have lost the joy of the Lord? Have we taken our eyes off the Lord and what He has done for us and is doing for us daily? Have we lost our joy because of our walking in our own willful way instead of walking with Him, walking in obedience to Him?

Daily, we should be rejoicing for the Lord of our salvation, giving thanks to Him for loving us as He does. We rejoice because He cares for us and is present to us in our daily walk with Him. A grateful heart, a heart of love, wants to be in communion, Holy Communion, with the Lord desiring to walk in His holiness. When we walk with the Lord, such joy will be ours. When we are talking and listening to the Lord, our hearts will rejoice as we walk closer and closer to the Lord.

When we walk with the Lord as His Holy Word directs, there will be a source of joy, a calm and composed mind that will not be unduly disturbed by the adversities that come to us. We will rejoice in the Lord that He is with us in the midst of those adversities. When we walk and talk with the Lord, His joy shall renew and strengthen us daily – His joy shall be our strength..
