How is it with your soul?

Despise not prophesying is, as is written in the *Message*, giving forth the Word of the Lord. When one is giving forth the Word of the Lord it will be Truth and will bring truth into our lives – though it may be a hard word. The Biblical writings are straight forward, and we hear the Prophets both the men and the women prophets in the Bible saying, **Thus saith the Lord!**

We need the Truth given to us from the Holy Bible and given to us from the Holy Bible through those called to preach and teach the Word. We need to listen to the Word and *hear* (obey) the Word given.

Despise not prophesying - is for those to whom the word is given through the preached Word, but also it is to those called to preach, to give forth the Word of the Lord. Though the Word is rejected, as you preach the Truth, despise not the calling God has upon your life nor the Word as the Lord gives it to you to preach. Stand firm in the Word in your walk with the Lord as well as giving forth the Truth.

Plumblime: I Thessalonians 5.20

Despise not prophesying.

Walking in the Light

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Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

We live in a society of climbers, people trying to get to the top in every aspect of life. The competition is great, and, sadly, it is about the individual himself or herself, not about helping people, but how can I be at the top. This is done in every aspect of life. This goes with the advertisement of "It's all about ME-e-e," sad to say.

What is in the world is, most of the time, in the "churches" and the church-goers take it to the church building where some of this may also exist in the churches. There is this ladder that people climb trying to get to be the top person, to be seen as The Person above all.

Bringing this down further, we may find that the top person is perceived as the one who is the most visible with the most attention being given them because of what their position is in the "pecking order."

Having written the above, we come to grips with "Despise not Prophesying." There are some positions in some "churches" that are perceived as being the top position and those people in that position are given great respect as being someone who is *right up there with Go* - but may not be of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The sad piece to this is that we misunderstand the teaching of the Word of God in the gifts and graces. We misunderstand that it takes the body to function as one to accomplish the will of the Lord. What if one of your legs began going backwards while the other leg went forward? What if you did not have toes or fingers, then what would you do? Do you understand that it is not what position you have, but are you doing what the Lord Jesus Christ has called you to do, AND do you understand that no matter what your work is, the body is needed. You are not above anyone, no matter what your work is. It is NONE ABOVE ANOTHER. It is about the Lord Jesus Christ and His work being accomplished in us as the Body of Christ.

There are those who believe their gift is better than another and they are, therefore, special; they feel they are above others. Then there are those called to prophecy, to speak forth the truth of God in Christ Jesus – which most do not want to hear. This is important, and we each should be speaking forth the Truth of God. We should not despise prophesying . . . we should want the truth of God to be spoken and encourage those who are faithful to the Word.
