## How is it with your soul?

Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

I Thessalonians 5.24 is important to bring us to the understanding that we are called into the fellowship of the Son of God and to His Kingdom and glory. When we are walking in the way of holiness, in the calling of the Lord upon our lives, we need to walk with confidence in Him. Too often, we say we are walking in the Lord – but, do we understand what that means.

Perhaps we need to look at the words more closely to understand the Lord Jesus Christ calls each to a different walk with Him, and yet the same walk as we walk together as the body of Christ. Some, perhaps, are called to suffer, some to be a witness to what the Lord has done for them during their time of persecution or grave illness.

Remember Lazarus whom God raised from the dead? Oh, we all want a miracle like that. And, yet, Lazarus did die as all must – until the time of the return of the Lord Jesus Christ when some are still on this earth.
