Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.

We see and experience the commission given to Christ's Holy Church being lived in one called Stephen, a deacon in the Primitive Church (Acts 6.8-15). Take time to read this passage with your heart. Sit with it and seek the Lord Jesus Christ.
