Amo 7:7 Thus he shewed me: and, behold, the Lord stood upon a wall [made] by a plumbline, with a plumbline in his hand.

How is it with your soul?

The Lord is holy God, and calls us to be a holy people, a holy nation. Look unto Him and be ye holy as is written in Leviticus 20.7.

Again, the Word of God tells us of His great love for us. Oh, why can we not live a life of holiness unto Him, receive His love and live for Him Who calls us to "come unto Me."

And from Jesus Christ, [who is] the faithful witness, [and] the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. **Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood,**

And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him [be] glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen (Rev 1.4-6).

Plumbline: Leviticus 20.6, 7

There is a chorus I heard some years ago that is a call unto us out of the above scripture.

Come and worship, Royal priesthood.
Come and praise Him, Royal nation.
Worship Jesus, our Redeemer.
He is precious, King of glory.

The words in I Peter and in the chorus are in other scriptures. Read them and lift up holy hands and praise the Lord for His mercy and love and grace in your life.

Deu 7:6 For thou [art] an holy people unto the LORD thy God: the LORD thy God hath chosen thee to be a special people unto himself, above all people that [are] upon the face of the earth.

Deu 7:7 The LORD did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people; for ye [were] the fewest of all people:

Deu 7:8 But **because the LORD loved you**, and because he would keep the oath which he had sworn unto your fathers, hath the LORD brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you out of the house of bondmen, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

Psa 119:11 Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee.
