Are you seeking the Lord daily in your life that you shall not falter, that you shall not fail the Lord Jesus Christ, in what He has called you to do for His glory? Take time to search your heart, your soul, in your walk with the Lord as you take time to read Chapters Two and Three in the Book of Revelation.

This is a time of seeking forgiveness in our lives - and seeking the Lord Jesus Christ to guide us in our daily walk, giving to us **eyes** to behold His glory, **ears** fine tuned as an instrument to the hearing of His voice, His Word, and a **heart** to walk in obedience to His call regardless of the cost.

His call to each of His followers is to "take up your cross daily and follow Me." May we daily pray an old hymn, "Just A Closer Walk with Thee, Grant it, Jesus, is my plea, Daily walking close to Thee, Let it be, dear Lord, let it be."
