## How is it with your soul?

The following are powerful commands that we need to read and re-read and hear (obey) the Lord in His commands to us that we might have life, life flowing from Him into us to give us the strength for the journey, for the walk with Him daily.

Say not thou, I will recompense evil; [but] wait on the LORD, and he shall save thee (Pro 20.22).

Are there [any] among the vanities of the Gentiles that can cause rain? or can the heavens give showers? [art] not thou he, O LORD our God? therefore we will wait upon thee: for thou hast made all these [things] (Jer 14.22).

For evildoers shall be cut off: but those that wait upon the LORD, they shall inherit the earth (Ps 37.9).

Behold, as the eyes of servants [look] unto the hand of their masters, [and] as the eyes of a maiden unto the hand of her mistress; so our eyes [wait] upon the LORD our God, until that he have mercy upon us (Psa 123:2).

And I will wait upon the LORD, that hideth his face from the house of Jacob, and I will look for him (Isa 8.17).

### Plumbline: Psalm 27.14

Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD.

Perhaps there needs to be some soul searching as King David prayed:

Psa 139:23 Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts:

Psa 139:24 And see if [there be any] wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

Rom 10:17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

When we wait upon the Lord, we are expecting something from Him. The Psalmist has written well giving us a greater understanding and directives for waiting in the presence of the Lord. Again, how long since you waited in the presence of the Lord, since you sought the Lord, desiring to live for Him, and took up your cross and followed Him – all the way.

Hear, O LORD, [when] I cry with my voice: have mercy also upon me, and answer me.

[When thou saidst], Seek ye my face; my heart said unto thee, Thy face, LORD, will I seek.

Hide not thy face [far] from me; put not thy servant away in anger: thou hast been my help; leave me not, neither forsake me, O God of my salvation.

When my father and my mother forsake me, then the LORD will take me up. Teach me thy way, O LORD, and lead me in a plain path, because of mine enemies.

Deliver me not over unto the will of mine enemies: for false witnesses are risen up against me, and such as breathe out cruelty.

[I had fainted], unless I had believed to see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living.

**Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD (Ps 27.7-14).**
